

7. Just past the South end of the footbridge, turn left onto the gravel path, past the interpretive kiosk on the right, and through the turnstile into the Walt Horan Natural Area.
8. Continue on gravel path, going straight when the path forks, and straight again when the path reaches a 4-way intersection. Continue through the nature area. There are several ponds and many wildlife viewing areas with interpretive signs in this part of the park. At the 6 concrete posts on right, continue straight ahead.
9. Exit the natural area through another turnstile and continue until the gravel path rejoins the paved path at Walla Walla Point Park. Turn left onto the paved trail.
10. In Walla Walla Point Park, note the Richard Beyer sculpture with interpretive sign on your left.

**CHECKPOINT #3:** What animal is holding the salmon? Please write your answer on the envelope.

11. At the salmon sculpture, take the left fork of path to the footbridge, cross footbridge, and continue on unpaved pathway onto the spit along the swimming lagoon. Turnaround point is the first stand of tall cottonwood trees on your right.
12. Retrace steps back to salmon sculpture. Turn right and return to the natural area, re-entering through the turnstile where you exited. On the return route, go **right** at concrete posts (first fork in the path), and right again at the 4-way intersection. Continue back to the paved trail, across footbridge, and back across Park Entrance road. Follow the trail back to your starting point at 27<sup>th</sup> NW, being careful not to miss the access pathway as it veers to the left back to the parking lot.
13. Drive back to Inn at the River to stamp your book.
